The Office of the Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs (VPFA), established July 2019, works closely with the Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor and faculty members across the university to support the continued excellence of DU faculty by enhancing faculty development initiatives, increasing faculty diversity, and building a strong, inclusive, and collaborative faculty community. Kate Willink, Associate Professor of Communication Studies, is the inaugural VPFA and works closely with deans and department heads to recruit and retain high-quality faculty, support faculty career advancement, and to create collaborative department cultures that support transparency, equity, trust and belonging.

As Director of Faculty Development & Career Advancement, Alison Staudinger works in the Office of the VPFA to support DU faculty in all series from hiring through retirement. Dr. Staudinger came to DU in January 2021 after eight years as a faculty member and three as a department and program chair at the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, and has the pleasure of working directly with new faculty through onboarding and the faculty learning community.
