To get started, I’d like to recommend a few steps new faculty can take to become acquainted with our services and resources.

- Get to know your [subject librarian](#). Subject librarians are assigned to each academic unit on campus. Your subject librarian can provide [research assistance](#) for both you and your students, [purchase materials](#) to add to our collections, teach [library workshops](#) to students in your courses, and develop [online guides](#) and videos for your classes.
- Browse our virtual and print collections. Search all of our collections with [Compass](#) or view the [complete list of our databases](#). Our [institutional repository](#) and [special collections](#) materials offer unique items for scholarship and teaching.
- See a gap in our collections? Consider submitting a request for our [New Faculty Library Fund](#) to add up to \$1,000 of materials to our Libraries.
- Contact our [Course Reserves team](#) to make your course readings accessible to your students on Canvas or 2U LMS.
- Visit the [Anderson Academic Commons \(Main Library\) in-person or virtually](#) to learn more about our spaces, collections, and events & exhibits.
